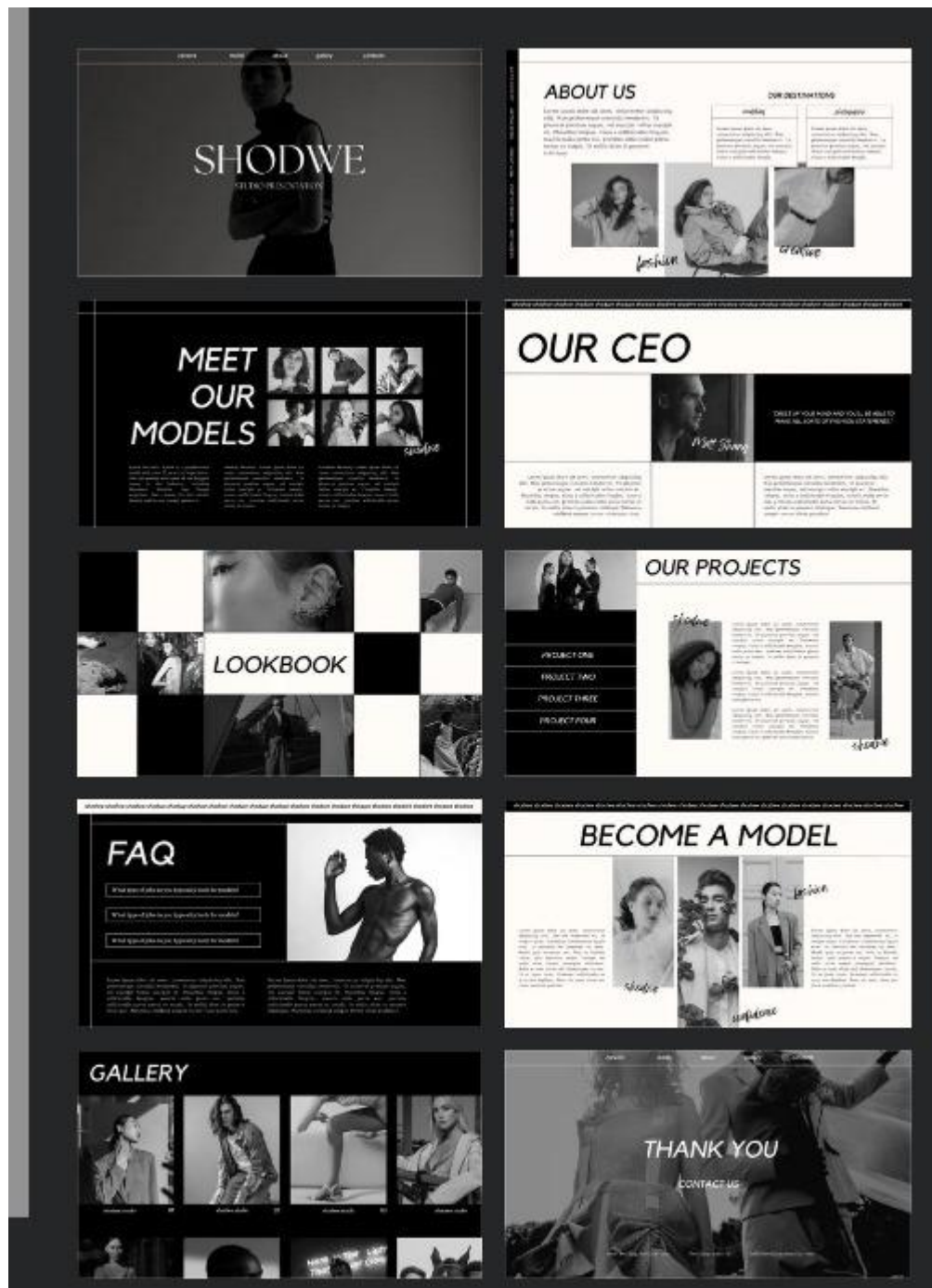

- **Accessible Content:** Content structured in a way that is easy to navigate and understand, catering to the needs of various stakeholders.

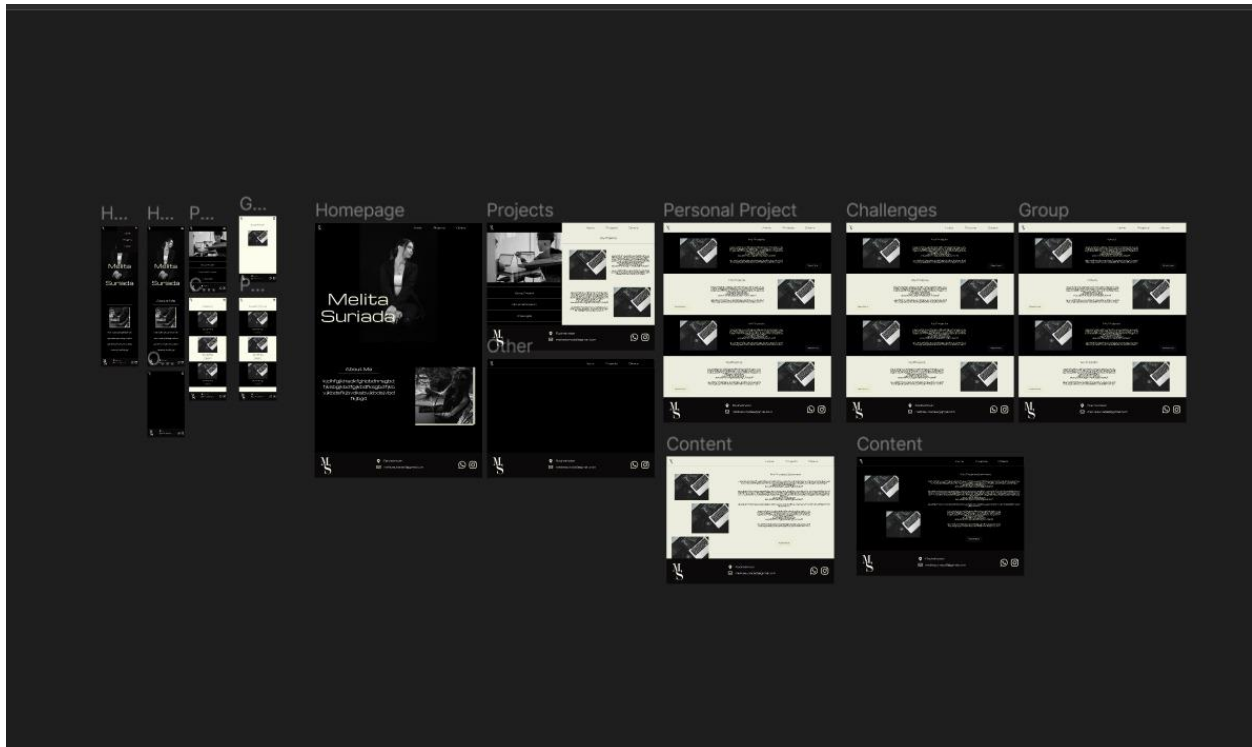
Design Phase
